

# A Year in our Life 2019-20

#### Welcome to the 2019-2020 Mid Sussex Voluntary Action (MSVA) Annual Report.

This has certainly been a period of change and disruption across the globe, as it has for MSVA. However, we have weathered the storm and look forward to the 'new normal' as it has been called. Quite what that will mean for everyone remains to be seen. We do know we will still be here to encourage, empower and enable the charities and voluntary groups of Mid Sussex as we move forward into the next phase.

#### Change

Our much-respected Manager Sue Edgson decided to move on to pastures new. She gave us many years of excellent service, both as a Volunteer Coordinator and subsequently as Team Manager. We thank her sincerely for making a huge contribution to the service and wish her well.

As we worked with Mid Sussex District Council, on shared objectives, it became clear that changes needed to be made to our service level agreement to address new and important challenges. The team stepped up to those challenges, including the delivery of three new client group related workshops. Feedback from participants proved these had been very successful.

We also began to raise the profile of the service, not only within our membership group, but also with councillors who represent our district and towns. An example of this was our new format Annual Meeting and AGM, which was well attended. The meeting headlined specific work done by a sample of our member groups and how they have benefited from their involvement with MSVA.

During this period of time, we were finding a sharp increase in the community development dimension of our work, ably encouraged and supported by Julia Beckett. It became clear to the Board of Trustees that we needed to expand this capacity, and we did so by recruiting Sasha Brown to work alongside Julia. This has enabled us to focus also on the needs of young people, with exciting and encouraging outcomes, and to deliver a series of 'dropin' support sessions for existing and potential members.

#### The Alliance

Throughout the period, we were also playing our part in the formation of the countywide West Sussex Community and Voluntary Sector infrastructure Alliance (WSCVSi Alliance), and engaging with the West Sussex Three Year Plan, which set the challenge: 'No change is not an option' - a challenge to which the Alliance willingly responded.

During this difficult time, thanks are due to my colleagues within the staff team and on the Board of Trustees, who worked tirelessly to deal with the relentless but inspiring challenges.

#### Additional global pandemic challenges

At the same time, we were in the process of recruiting a new Manager. By February 2020, we were fortunate to have Lauren Lloyd come into post. She was aware of the challenges ahead and was relishing them. However, if that were not enough, a few short weeks after her arrival, towards the end of her induction, Lauren and the team were further challenged by the unwarranted changes brought about by COVID-19. Our world changed in an instant. We began working from home, using new technology to 'meet', and working ever closer with our funding partners. Like everyone else, we had to adjust our priorities and needed to maintain and then build our finances.

In addition to the staff and Trustees, I am extremely proud of the amazing efforts and successes that have taken place jointly with both countywide public and voluntary sector colleagues; and humbled by the vast numbers of volunteers who have stepped forward to meet the challenges we face now, and in the future. The story will continue in our next Annual Report.


