





Other areas of work we developed include setting up the Mid Sussex Food Partnership; working on Digital Inclusion and focussing on addressing social isolation.


In spite of working from home, we have delivered training sessions, Forums and ran innovative online volunteer match-making events.

We did so through a truly dedicated staff, working closely with trustees and our funders, embracing the need to work effectively and efficiently online to maintain and extend our services to the Mid Sussex community and voluntary sector. These services were vital in providing a comprehensive and proactive response to the unique economic and social demands posed by the pandemic.

Thus MSVA provided training, advice on funding, volunteering, setting up new voluntary groups and the development of Food Partnerships. We have also begun work on Digital Access and Inclusion, Tackling Loneliness and working with Diverse Communities.

All this indicates the range of our activities, one relentlessly focussed on promoting community development in Mid Sussex, providing support to existing local charities and helping grow new ones to meet emerging community needs.

2020-21 - The Year of the Pandemic

Responding to lockdown

We supported Mid Sussex Mutual Aid groups, which formed in response to community needs across the District, by ensuring they had the resources and guidance to operate safely and within safeguarding guidelines.

We stayed in regular contact with them and assisted with finding funding, supplying templates of policies, enabling networking and keeping all up-to-date with the rapidly changing legislation for volunteers.

We held Zoom sessions individually as well as for groups and offered support in any way we could.

We compiled a list of Mid Sussex Mutual-Aid groups which was available on our website and allowed members of the public to contact groups in their area to ask for help or to join them as volunteers.

We were tasked by WSCC to act as a Volunteer Hub which included matching an increased number of volunteers with available roles.


We focussed on raising our profile by engaging the help of a PR agency which enabled us to ensure that the community at large knew about the support we were offering.

Helping to fill gaps in service


As well as supporting our member groups, we took active steps to fill gaps in service in the Mid Sussex community.

We worked on setting up Digital Inclusion and Food Partnership projects, and were instrumental in bringing the services of Charity Mentors from East to West Sussex.

By co-working with local organisations, we assisted in setting up digital classes and helped to supply IT equipment to local seniors and to home-schooling children.







We helped groups get funding

We ran information sessions with local funders and a series of fundraising workshops to give groups the knowledge and know-how to apply for funding.

By working closely with East Grinstead Common Good Trust we helped to bring £20k to charities in that area.

Assisting local not-for-profits

Our services contribute to building a stronger voluntary and community sector by providing expertise, advice, guidance and logistical support.

We aim to enhance resilience and sustainability through funding advice and support, facilitating and enabling connectivity, sharing best practice and pooling resources.

MSVA members received over 200 hours of one-to-one support on topics such as:

- Funding Advice
- Networking, Linking, Connecting
- Volunteering Best Practice
- Marketing & Promotion
- Setting up a community group, charity, CIC or CIO
- Policies & Procedures
- Governance
- Safeguarding and DBS

We ran 18 online meetings:

- 8 Forums: for groups working in three specific sectors 3rd
 Age & Beyond; Inclusive Health; Children, Young People &
 Families.
- 7 Drop-ins: our Drop-ins gave groups and volunteers the opportunity to find out how we can support them.
- 2 Volunteer Matchmaking Events: these sessions provided the opportunity for groups to introduce themselves to potential volunteers and vice versa.
- 1 Food Partnership Meeting: we helped to set up this new ongoing initiative of groups to help those that provide food to people in need.

Volunteering

There has been a vast increase in people wishing to volunteer - MSVA registered 439 potential volunteers compared to 225 the previous year!

We have adjusted our website to make it easier for those looking to volunteer in response to Covid-19 and for those looking for home-based volunteering opportunities.

We responded to all volunteering enquiries, referred all potential volunteers to available roles and followed up on their progress.

At least 92 people started volunteering as a direct result of MSVA's referrals.

As an alternative to our Volunteer Fairs we ran two online
Volunteer Matchmaking Events where over 20 local
organisations had the opportunity to introduce their work and
volunteering roles to over 60 potential volunteers.

To address the increased demand for volunteering roles and a greater need to support groups with volunteer recruitment and management, we have secured funding to recruit a Volunteering Development Co-ordinator for Mid Sussex.

Training

We ran 13 Training Courses which were attended by 221 people. We also added a webpage listing courses from other providers which proved to be one of the most visited on our website!




Alliance Membership
